### The Lean Competency System

The Lean Competency System (LCS) is a lean qualifications framework used by organisations to support lean training programmes, centres of excellence or academies and by employees and lean practitioners as a vehicle to develop lean thinking knowledge and practical skills.

### Seven Levels of Competency

The LCS framework has seven levels of competency covering the spectrum of lean knowledge and application. They are grouped into three categories:

1: Fundamental	Level 1A	Awareness
	Level 1B	Diagnosis & Analysis
1: F	Level 1C	Improvement & Implementation
2: Technical	Level 2A	Implementation & Design
	Level 2B	Implementation & Leadership
3: Strategic	Level 3A	Strategic Entreprise
	Level 3B	Strategic Supply Chain

For organisations with their own lean training capability for staff (or planning one).

Designed for the needs and operating conditions of start up or smaller enterprises.

Experienced lean practitioners can become LCS certified at Level 2 through the APLE route.

Senior lean practitioners can become certified through the APLE Level 3 Programme.

For consultancies or training companies with a lean training system capability for clients  $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{T}^M$  staff or for public programmes.

The accredited company delivers training aligned to the LCS framework, though does not administer knowledge tests.

Provides recognition for lean knowledge gained from prior learning and achievements in employment.

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Provides independent endorsement of lean training, indicating it is well managed, professionally delivered and technically robust. The LCS organisation organises assessments via its on-line testing facility and issues Certificates to successful candidates.

Level 2 competence includes an in depth knowledge of lean principles and techniques, plus leadership capability. The supported programme includes writing three strategic case studies and an assignment on the evolution and future of lean thinking.

For practitioners, the LCS offers a qualification which has high perceived value and external credibility. Accredited companies pay a comparatively smaller accreditation fee, plus a fee per certificate issued to learners. An application form detailing career history plus two case studies are submitted and evaluated.

Guidance and support is provided throughout the Level 3 Programme by LCS Level 3 Advisors.

Accredited organisations are licenced for two years and can issue Certificates of Lean Competency to learners.

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Level 2 candidates may be required to undertake an online knowledge test as part of their applications.

The Level 3 Programme can be undertaken on an individual or a group basis and takes 6 to 9 months to complete.

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Successful Level 2 candidates can register as Practitioner Members of the LCS community free of charge. Level 3 advisory support is available from the LCS centrally or through LCS level 3 accredited consultancies.



### LERC & Cardiff University

The LCS was created in 2005 by the Lean Enterprise Research Centre, Cardiff Business School, as a mechanism to promote and develop lean understanding and application in organisations. In 2014 a new company was launched to hold the Cardiff University LCS licence, with a remit to develop and promote the LCS.

### Accredited Organisations

The LCS is used by a wide variety of organsiations in many sectors and countries, including banking, insurance  $\vartheta$  financial services, manufacturing, logistics and distribution, eductaion, media, healthcare, local  $\vartheta$  central government, energy  $\vartheta$  utilities and professional services.
